

- Children's Day: On the 14" of November, a special morning assembly was conducted by the




teachers to wish the students on the occasion of Children's Day. A fancy fete was organized to make the day more special and delightful for the children.

Golden Jubilee Celebration - Inaugural Ceremony


The fifty year mark is a profound milestone in Nirmala Convent's journey as a school, providing academic and human excellence.






Uttarakhand Sports State






