Poet Mary Oliver said "Keep some room in your heart for the unimaginable". This seems just right for the year gone by. In the form of Corona virus, a black swan had landed. With the outbreak of the Corona virus epidemic in the beginning of the year 2020, there was panic all around. It soon gripped the entire world and wrecked havoc with our daily schedule, throwing everything out of gear. There was an environment of fear and apprehension and with the lockdown; all activities including studies came to a standstill. Schools and other institutions were shutdown. Like most of the other activities, studies too shifted to the online medium.

At Nirmala Convent, we too were compelled by the dire circumstances to shift to this mode of teaching. Yes, it seemed to be a daunting task as everyone was caught unawares, with no prior planning for such a situation. Each and every student and teacher took up this challenge and soon settled into the 'online education' mode. The teachers have been continuously updating and upgrading their skills to ensure that there are no learning gaps for the students and at present, online teaching is running smoothly along with the physical classes for classes VI-XII.

As we get ready to begin the new session from April 2021, we thank the Almighty for his grace and with gratitude recall the significant moments of the year 2020.

❖ New academic session 2020-21:

Covid-19 pandemic and the subsequent nationwide lockdown posed challenges for the school. Physical classes were not possible and online teaching became the new normal. The new academic session began with online classes, on April 8th 2020.

- The online classes are being conducted through CI-soft IT care app and Microsoft teams. Parents received regular updates of their ward in the form of e-report cards through CI-soft app, even during the lockdown period.
- Regular online assessments were carried out to monitor the academic performance of the students. Objective and subjective assessments were done using tools like 'Google form' and Whatsapp.
- CBSE Workshop/Training programmes: Teachers are continuously keeping themselves abreast of the latest developments in the field of online teaching by attending monthly CBSE workshops and various other online training programmes. This is an effort by the teaching staff to upgrade their skills and to be ready for the changes in teaching that lie ahead.
- National Education Policy-2020 (NEP-2020): A new education policy (NEP-2020) was announced by the government and a major focus this year has been on understanding NEP-2020 and making the students and parents aware of the same. Our teachers have attended numerous sessions on the same to acquaint themselves with the new policy and to prepare for the changes and challenges that lie ahead.

School Examinations: Due to the Pandemic, all exams during the current session were held online, except the Pre-Board II of Classes X and XII. The remedial and extra classes are being held physically in school for Classes IX-XII. The Annual Exams will be held online for Classes I – VIII and Offline for Classes IX – XII.
